- The major purposes of the program are:
 - 1) Increased visibility and presence for the Board of Education
 - 2) Opportunities to provide information on Board of Education structure and procedures
 - 3) Act as a liaison between Board of Education and PTO's
 - 4) Act as liaison between Board of Education and school administration
 - 5) Become more knowledgeable of both the progress and the needs of each school
 - 6) Opportunities to attend special school events

Mr. Cullinan will develop written documents regarding Board structure, agendas, meetings, committees etc. for members to use when meeting or responding to PTO members, school administration, staff, members of the public etc.

- The committee reviewed the proposed gift from the Class of 2011. The class wishes to plant six trees at the high school. A review of the proposed location has revealed a number of issues including maintenance and security. Alternative locations are being reviewed. The superintendent will inform the committee of a new proposed location with information related to areas of concern such as security, building maintenance, snow removal etc.
