Ellington Public Schools is offering academic enrichment programs after school with a focus on Art and Mathematics. The schedules vary by program, so please review the specific dates, times and targeted grades carefully. Please be aware that space is limited for each program and subject to sufficient enrollment. As such, students must be enrolled at the school in which the program is being offered.

Parents must arrange for students to be picked up from the school promptly at the end of the session. Parents should use the main office entrance when picking up their child.

THE S.T.E.A.M. KITCHEN at Windermere School (Grades 2-5)

This is a hands-on cooking class in which students will explore STEAM concepts as they relate to the food we eat. Some examples of this are: what is emulsion (science), cooking then vs. now (technology), pizza fractions (mathematics).

In each class, students will learn about a different STEAM topic as they follow and prepare a simple recipe.

They will participate in games and/or activities relevant to the topic of the day, and will savor their creations at the end of each class.

MATHCOUNTS is a national math enrichment program & competition series focused on engaging the critical thinking and problem-solving skills of middle school students in grades 7-8. The Competition Series has 4 levels of competition—school, chapter, state and national. Each level of competition is comprised of 4 rounds—Sprint, Target, Team, and Countdown Round.

At MATHCOUNTS meetings, we will play fun math games and work together to solve different types of math challenges. We will also prepare for a competition that will take place in February against other middle school students across the state.

The EMS MathCounts Club will meet starting in December and the advisor, Mr. Trout, will be sending information out about how to join in the late fall.
