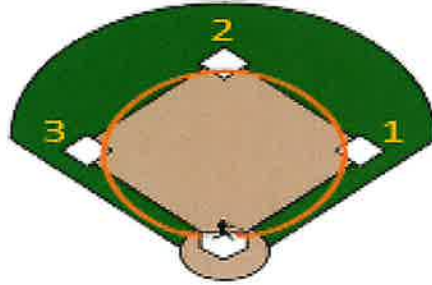

The Ellington Public Schools BASES program supports students who reside in Ellington and other area towns grades (K-6) who require programming outside of the traditional educational setting.

The BASES program focuses on social emotional and behavioral support above and beyond what can be provided in a student's home school. Supports are provided on a TIERED System with the goal of reintegrating students back into their home school. We also offer services and support through graduation at the Secondary BASES program located at 89 West Road. Faculty and staff focus on building relationships with students by engaging them in individualized learning and preferred activities. Faculty and staff prioritize connecting with students and families on a level where the entire family feels supported and safe.

The multidisciplinary team at BASES provides a trauma based approach which provides a safe place for students to learn how to regulate their emotions while obtaining high level academic instruction and real world experience allowing students to be college and career ready.

Program Components

Staffing:

- Special Education Teacher
- Full-time School Social Worker
- School Psychologist Support (testing)
- Paraeducator staff
- OT, PT, SLP, BCBA
- Administrative Support
- Nurse support as needed

Academics:

- Based on student need and grade level
- Curriculum aligned with Ellington Public Schools and IEP Goals and Objectives
- Small group instruction
- Centers Based Activities
- 1:1 Instruction

SEL:

- Full time social worker
- Group Counseling
- Individual Counseling
- Family counseling
- In home visits as needed for school avoidance
- RULER: Self Regulation and Growth
- Field Trips
- Community Outings
- Bigs/Littles opportunities for middle and high school students to work with elementary students

Community Wraparound Services Integration and Collaboration:

- Team will work with DCF to support any family plans
- Ellington Youth Services
- Team will work with IICAPS for families who qualify
- Ellington Truancy Board
