## Ellington Athletic Department Hires Brady Johnson as Head Football Coach

Coach Johnson with his wealth of experience begins duties this Spring 2024

**ELLINGTON, CT** - The Athletic Department is pleased to announce the hiring of Brady Johnson who will be taking over as the Varsity Football Coach. Brady Johnson comes to Ellington from Coon Rapids, Iowa where he taught PE and Health, and served as the head strength and conditioning coach for the high school's athletics programming. He was also the assistant football, basketball, baseball, and track coach.

Coach Johnson holds a Bachelor's in Exercise Science/Kinesiology and K-12 Health and Physical Education Certification from Central College in Pella, Iowa. He will obtain his Master's Degree in School Leadership and Education from Dordt University in Sioux Center, Iowa this August.

Coach Johnson was a stand-out multi-sport athlete for all four years at Stanton High School. He played football, basketball, baseball, and ran track. In his high school career as a football player, Coach Johnson racked up over 2,000 career yards receiving, 20 touchdowns, and 181 receptions. He earned First Team All-State Selection and was a unanimous First Team All-District/Conference player. Coach Johnson continued his athletic career at Central College where he played football in the position of wide receiver and tight end for the university.
